


The Statement of the Forest Policy of the Colony of Sarawak was approved by the Governor-in-Council on 23 December 1954

To manage the productive forests of the Permanent Forest Estate with the object of obtaining the highest possible revenue compatible with the principle of sustained yield and with the primary objects set out above

To promote, as far as may be practicable, the thorough and economical utilisation of obtaining the highest possible revenue compatible with the principle of sustained yield and with the primary objects set out above


To foster, as far as may be compatible with the prior claims of local demands, a profitable export trade in the forest produce.
