

# V-Legal Document

- Export license document for timber products
- Valid for 26 HS-Codes since 1<sup>st</sup> January 2013, and all over 40 HS-Codes starts on January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2014 (Trade Minister Regulation No. 64/2012)
- Issued by Legality Verification Bodies
- Issued for every invoice to exporters having an official legality certificate (or through inspection for exporters who have not yet held certificate)








### 10 Biggest Export Destination by Weight (Kg): Jan– Sep 2013
